As I mark the 30th anniversary of my ordination two verses of scripture and a quote capture the joy that is my daily bread because of the Call of Christ to me to live into my Baptism as a priest of the Episcopal Church. My parents planted in my siblings and me faith that has anchored generations of our family. My life overflowed with adults who practiced their faith while nurturing me to claim my own. I knew I was going to be a priest before the Episcopal Church was

ordaining women. One of the first people I spoke to about experiencing a Call to ordination was a close friend of our family, The Reverend Roy Hendricks. When my trembling voice spoke the words to 'Uncle Roy' he embraced me and said, "God and I have been waiting since you were two." My parents remembered his words all those years before.

It has been a humble privilege to have served alongside God's faithful in the parishes, dioceses, and communities I have known. St. Martin's, Maywood, where I was raised and formed; Eagle's Nest, now Cross Roads Camp; The Church of the Messiah, Chester / Long Valley, my sponsoring congregation; The Church Divinity School of the Pacific, my seminary. Also, the parishes where I have served in my ordained ministry, St. Peter's, Mountain Lakes; Christ Church, Los Altos, CA; St. Timothy's, Danville, CA; All Saints, Bergenfield; St. Alban's, Oakland / Franklin Lakes, NJ; and now here at All Saints, Bay Head – a gift I could never have dreamed. Each community welcomed and engaged in forming me, encouraging me, forgiving me, and celebrating with me.

To my family, and especially to my beloved Nicholas Alan, my love and thanks overflow. To all who have shared your lives with me and enriched mine, I am humbled by your faith. It has been the honor of my life to offer God's Sacraments and be invited into the hopes, joys, challenges, sorrows, and everything that human life presents.



A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of

the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, "Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name"; and again he says, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people"; and again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise him"; and again Isaiah says,

"The root of Jesse shall come, the one who rises to rule the Gentiles; in him the Gentiles shall hope." May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'"

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing

floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
