In Memoriam

Our beloved parish family member and supporter, the Rev. Herbert "Bert" Draesel, Jr. (1940-2023), passed away on Saturday, January 14. He and Ada have been at the very heart of this family of faith for decades. They were among the very first to embrace me with a loving welcome upon my arrival to All Saints. It was my distinct privilege to serve with Bert when I

could convince him to leave Ada's side in the pew and join me at the altar. While I knew some of the vast expanse

of his priestly and musical ministry, it was just recently that I learned he is the composer of *The Rejoice Mass*, which he wrote while in seminary in 1964 and which my father

Parish Annual Meeting scheduled for Jan. 29

All Saints will hold its Annual Meeting on January 29, in compliance with the statutes of the State of New Jersey. The meeting will begin at 10:10 a.m. in the sanctuary of the church and encompass the 10:15 service of Holy Eucharist. Prior to the entrance hymn, the meeting will be opened and the slate of nominees for wardens, vestry, treasurer, and deputies for the diocesan convention will be announced. During the sermon, the Rev. King will offer her annual address.

The meeting will continue following service when parish members in good standing (that is, those registered in the rolls of the church, who attend regularly, and are known to the treasurer) will vote on the nominees. Following a presentation of the budget passed by the vestry on December 12, 2022, and with the conclusion of all required business, the meeting will be adjourned.

The election slate is as follows:

- For three-year terms on Vestry: Linda Carduner, Michael Ling, Chris Niebling
- For two-year term as Senior Warden: Steven Beresik
- For one-year term as Treasurer: Mark Durham
- For one-year term as Deputies to the Diocesan Convention: Steven Beresik, Joe DeAmicis, Gerald Harvey
- Alternate for Diocesan Convention: Sheila Pardoe

Note that Joe DeAmicis will continue to serve the final year of his term as Junior Warden.

What is Candlemas?

If you finally put away your Christmas decorations at Epiphany, you might have done so too soon. As we are still finding the brittle needles from our tree in the carpet, it's surprising to learn that in many countries the tradition remains to display nativity mangers until Candlemas on Feb. 2.



One of the oldest holy feasts of the Christian calendar, this day is also known as the Feast of the Presentation or as the Feast of the Purification of the Virgin Mary.

Dating back to the 4th century in Jerusalem, Christians have marked the day when Mary presented the infant Jesus at the temple. According to the Gospel of Luke, it was on this occasion that Simeon held Jesus in his arms and declared him “a Light to the World.”

Echoing Simeon’s words, about 1,000 years ago Christians began blessing candles on this day, which is seen as the last feast of the Christmas cycle that began with Advent.

By 541 A.D., facing a dreadful plague

that had ravaged Constantinople, Emperor Justinian I ordered prayer processions in that city during the Feast of the Presentation to plead for God’s help in saving the city from the disease. After the plague passed, the regular celebration of Candlemas was adopted throughout the Roman Empire.

But long before this, ancient Romans, as well as pagan Irish, celebrated the mid-point between the winter and spring solstices in early February. It was a time when crops might be planted and thus predictions about the weather were popular. Early Christians held that if it was sunny on Candlemas, winter would last for six more weeks. Sound familiar?

The Germans, who brought Groundhog Day with them to the United States, believed the remaining amount of winter could be determined by whether a badger would leave his home (sett) on Candlemas.

More deliciously, the French, who refer to the day as La Chandeleur, enjoy crepes (pancakes rolled into a candle shape) on Candlemas.
