Saturday, May 18, and Sunday, May 19, will be BIG DAYS for All Saints! After month of preparation, on May 18, we will present Shea Bicking, Eric Canales, and Brannon McBride for Confirmation at Trinity Cathedral in Trenton at 11 a.m. Holly Canales, who participated in the Confirmation program before Covid but was not confirmed will also be


A Message from Kathryn and Tyde

Remember that sweet little puppy I adopted (see photo below)? At the time, I was told Tyde, who is part Australian shepherd dog, would top the scales at 30-35 pounds. Well, he's still sweet but weighs 75 pounds!

Recognizing that he has more energy than control by nature, Tyde and I have been working with a private trainer. As part of his training program, Tyde now wears an "E collar." It is *not* a shock collar. Instead, the collar issues a pulse much like a Tens muscle stimulator used in physical therapy — which the dog learns to respond to when he needs a correction off leash.

It is my goal for Tyde to learn to be calm and look to me for direction so that he can be with me at the office rather than home alone for long hours. The training, of course, is as much for me as it is for Tyde! Our trainer, Julie Root of Corrected Canines, is pleased with the progress that both Tyde and I are making!

Meanwhile, we could use your help. If you see and hear me working with Tyde, please follow my lead. For now, it is important that he gets treats only from me.



He will want to greet and interact with you, and I want that, too. But please wait for me to be sure he is listening to my commands and that I have him under control. Once he is calm, I will reward him and allow him to greet you. If he gets too excited and jumps, I will bring him back to the "down" position before allowing him to approach you again.

Thank you in advance for your patience with both of us in our training. It is working already!



Music at All Saints

On May 17, at 7:30 p.m., All Saints will host a Golden Anniversary Concert for out Casavant Pipe Organ. Dr. Mark Trautman will lead the All Saints Chamber Orchestra with organ soloist Dr. Michael J. Diorio in works of Bach, Guilmant, Krebs, Lefebvre, Mozart, and Reinkin. Included will be the famed virtuosic Organ Concerto in D-minor by J.S. Bach.



Our tracker organ was first played by Dr. Lee Hastings Bristol, Jr. on Easter Day 1974. It was formally dedicated that year at the opening of the summer season by the Rt. Rev. Albert W. Van Duzer, then Bishop of the Diocese of New Jersey on June 30, 1974.

This anniversary concert will closely mirror the opening one played by Dr. Bristol with strings and woodwinds in May 1974. Some of you will remember the featured organist for this celebratory performance. Dr. Diorio, who holds music degrees from Westminster Choir College in Princeton and the Yale Institute of Sacred Music, as well as a doctoral degree from Boston University, led a well received program exploring the *1982 Hymnal* last spring at All Saints.

This free program will be followed by a reception in Bristol Hall, featuring wines donated by our parishioner vintners Mark and Linda Carduner as well as a 50th anniversary cake!

Please join us for what promises to be a very exceptional evening.
