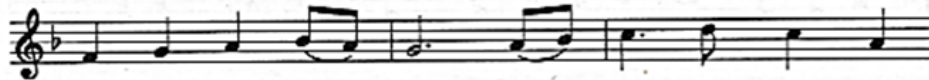
***Here's what's coming up at All Saints:***

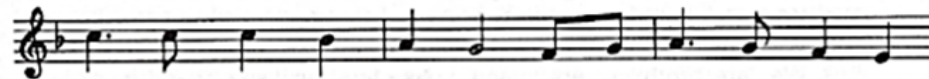

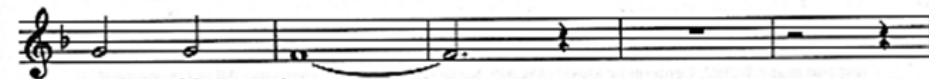
