A Reading from Paul's letter to the Romans (6:12-23)

Do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that

you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So, what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

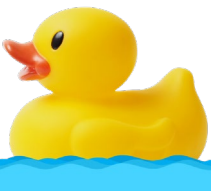

Reflections on Stewardship
Designated Gifts vs. Pledging

All Saints' annual stewardship campaign is our ongoing effort to encourage transformational giving that does more than cover the costs of building this community of faith. It also helps continue our 137-year-old mission of serving God and the community, feeding the hungry, lifting spirits, and building relationships. As we prepare for our July 12 Day of Giving when we will celebrate our stewards and encourage others to join them, here are some thoughts on stewardship for our consideration and prayer.

Some of us note that All Saints has gotten some big donations and bequests in the past few years and may wonder why we just can't use that money for our everyday expenses such as utility bills, salaries, office supplies, etc.

We have been blessed indeed by people who want to support All Saints in very specific ways. For example, you may remember that last fall a friend of the parish gave us a substantial gift (a challenge grant) designated particularly for the purchase of a much-needed new piano. We also received a generous bequest, which has been invested thoughtfully with the approval of the vestry. Most of these donors intended their gifts to help us meet the special needs of the parish rather than for us to pay for our annual operating expenses.

All Saints always welcomes gifts and donations for specific purposes. By comparison, annual pledging is about providing All Saints with the income it needs now to continue its mission and ministry to the congregation and the wider community. Your pledge, which is not a designated gift, allows the vestry to use this income responsibly and equitably across the parish budget rather than directing it to a particular aspect of parish life.
